Leave a lasting legacy

It is up to you whether you tell us. We know this is a very private matter, but we would like the opportunity to thank you and talk with you about how your money might be used.

How to make a bequest to TARSA:

Speak with your lawyer/trust company

Making a Will can help your family deal with a difficult time so we think everyone should make a Will. Speak to your lawyer, the Public Trust or another trust company about making a Will or changing your existing Will to include a bequest to TARSA, as an organisation that you want to support.

Decide whether to tell your family and friends

While you do not have to consult anyone about how you want to arrange your affairs, speaking to your family and friends about your decisions might help them to give effect to your charitable goals.

How do I make a gift in my will?

See your lawyer, the Public Trust, a trustee company, your local Community Law Centre who can advise you how to do this.

There are various options. You can make:

- A residual gift – once you have looked after your family and friends, you can leave the residual of the estate to TARSA.
- A percentage –you may choose to gift all or a percentage of your estate to TARSA. This way if the value of your assets increases or decreases, so does your gift.
- A specific gift – you decide a specific gift, this could be a set amount of money, shares, real estate or such other assets as you choose.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT – 31 AUGUST 2024

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1. ACCOUNTING SERVICES – PKF

As mentioned in last month's report, the quality of the service from PKF has been lacking, particularly with regards to the monthly management reports. Although changing accountants incurs additional costs, it may be time for a possible change to be investigated. We have looked at the accounting costs in the accounts of similar organisations, and they appear to be lower. If the quality was there, it would not be an issue but there have been problems with PKF's service. There is minimal business advice received and although we were given assurance last September from Alison Nation that she would review the management reports before they were sent to us, this has not happened.

The Finance Committee is investigating alternatives to PKF. It may be that options are limited but it is time to look into the options.

2. Application of Funds Received from the Repayment of Loan by the Ivor Walter Stickley Charitable Trust

The recommendations have now all been actioned:

Balance Bank 31.08.24: \$59,326

Further capital Expenditure \$25,690

Balance available \$33,636

Of the original liquidity buffer of \$100,000, \$33,636 remains.

Review of progress - Don't lose sight of what has been achieved in the last 9 months

- Reduced costs: audit, no longer sponsoring the rugby club fuel, double line in the bar, and have to mention the fish tank & newspaper. Many small savings have been made which are having a positive effect, although small they do add up.
- *Profit margins are improving.* Graeme has calculated that some positive improvements here are starting to come through.
- Full kitchen operations – with a second chef we're now in a position to extend the catering operation, provide wider services.
- Improved purchasing power in the bar – Lion sponsorship
- Graeme and the team have several ideas on improving what the Club can offer. Note - a strong team spirit has developed and is having an overall positive effect.
- Air conditioning has been replaced.
- Policies have been updated which provides clarification and has helped reduce audit costs although the full benefits will take time to flow through.
- Processes are being reviewed and monitored to ensure results can be relied on e.g. membership.

- Loans have been cleared and accounts are up to date.
- Finances are being carefully monitored.
- The Balance Sheet is positive with current assets covering current liabilities – looking back over the financial accounts for the last 10 years this has rarely been the case. Yes, this takes into account the \$209,326 of Stickley loan repayment funds still held, but these funds are actually there and available. How they are to be used, is the issue.

Where are we at today?

The results in this month's management reports are encouraging. Over \$40,000 of costs relating to annual licenses, audit and accounting costs have now been accounted for. The cash balance at the start of the year was \$146,331 and has reduced by \$56,267 to \$93,064 at 31 August BUT this includes repayment of the \$42,545 of debentures and over \$11,000 in the reduction of other loans.

At the 31 August 2024, \$33,636 is available from the original loan repayment for general expenditure and a further \$25,690 for capital expenditure. How is this to be spent? The revolving credit facility is being used and is in line with the finance plan. (\$27,661.02 drawn to date).

The plan was to use the Stickley repayment to buy time while improvements to operations were made – to date, this has been a successful strategy. Positive progress has been made.

Costs must continue to be carefully managed, but increasing turnover must now be the focus. Graeme has indicated that to break even from a cash perspective, approximately \$50,000 of net income is required.

Where to now?

Reducing opening hours has been suggested. What would this achieve? Will opportunities be missed? Reducing hours does little to alter the profitability ratios and fixed costs are still incurred. Will still be in the same loss situation.

Capital expenditure – what are the priorities? There are many options to be investigated but the focus must be to increase turnover. Sourcing outside funding – wholly or partially funded capital expenditure from donations takes the pressure off the Club finances which are still fragile.

Offering more – e.g. once the coffee machine is operational, provide food to go with coffee etc. There are various options along these lines. Management and staff have many ideas that could have merit. Changes are gradually being made, and results monitored.

Changing the kitchen closing from Tuesday to Monday – save on statutory holiday rates as most stats fall on a Monday but the focus is on increasing turnover. Additional chef provides opportunities to extend not reduce.

Close on all statutory holidays except ANZAC day - closure would reduce wage costs and provide staff with a break. Important to look after staff.

MUST CONTINUE TO LOOK FORWARD BUT WITH CAUTION – TRY NEW IDEAS - MONITOR THEM TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE ACTUALLY INCREASING TURNOVER AND IMPROVING PROFIT.

14. GENERAL BUSINESS

T Findlay raised that Grants from Gaming require to be reviewed and funding used. Terry updated members that TA RSA had three votes at National Conference and that we should encourage that at Conference. He understands that National bylaws are underway. He disagrees that District has the ability to vote at TARSAs but welcomes their attendance and to provide speaking rights. He encourages the policy to provide proxy votes at National Conference. He also believes that the label of Supporter Member needs to be changed. Terry recommends that a letter be written to District President from TA RSA recording our thoughts. It was agreed that D van der Hulst and D Bowler would draft a letter.

Terry questioned the legalities of having a Gaming Machine Flag displayed. G Ambler provided assurance that it was legal.

Terry advised committee members of refreshing the dining room and removal of clutter within the club. Other members warned of the need to be careful with decluttering as there is valuable artefacts within the club.

M Peterson suggested that Lighthouse TV Advertising needs to be removed. 12 Months' notice is required to be given to Lighthouse.
