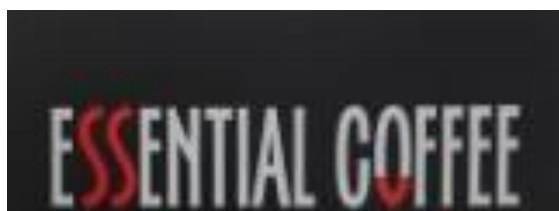

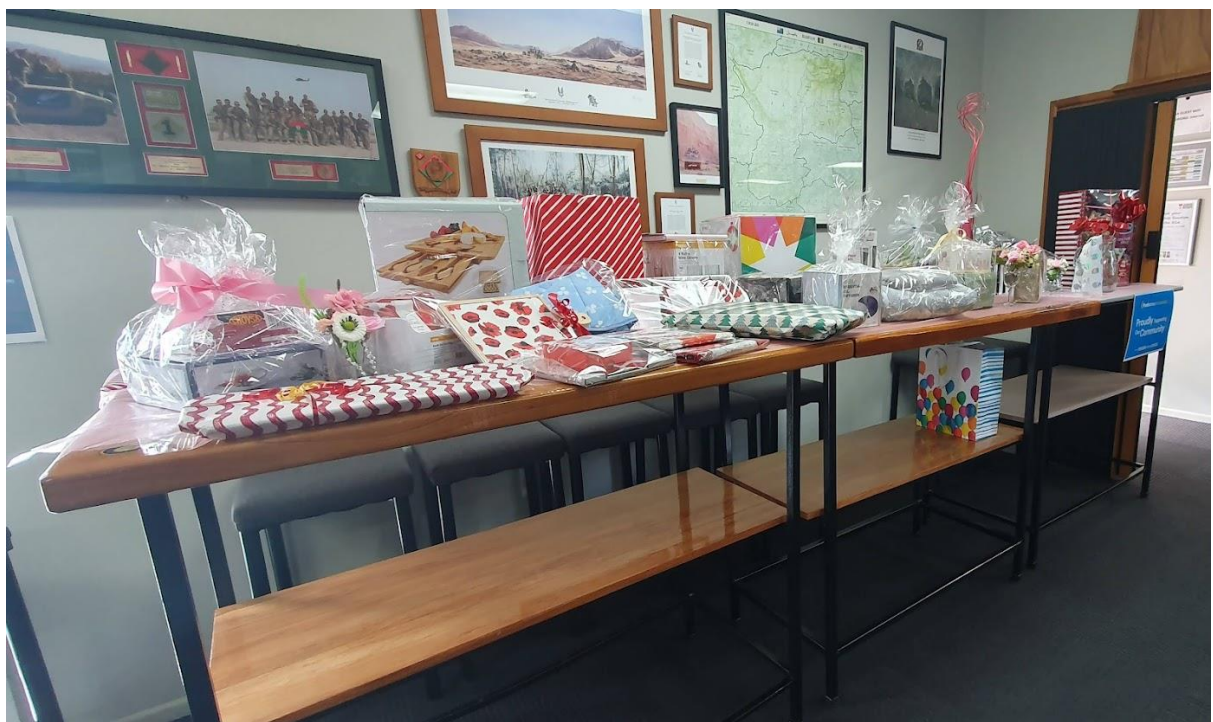

6. The Manager or any Member on the Executive is not Paddy's reporting up line.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT – 30 SEPTEMBER 2024

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING – 24 OCTOBER 2024

1. ACCOUNTING SERVICES – PKF

The Finance Committee is investigating alternatives to PKF. Three firms have been approached. One is interested and appears to have the necessary management accounting and Xero expertise as well as offering general financial accounting services. They recommend that PKF complete the 2025 financial year reporting and audit requirements. The new accountant would commence the 2025/26 year reporting on 1 April 2025 while PKF completes 2024/25 work. Discussions are continuing. It is important to ensure there is a good 'fit' with the new firm and that they do have the expertise required. Looking at getting a quote.

2. Application of Funds Received from the Repayment of Loan by the Ivor Walter Stickley Charitable Trust

The recommendations have now all been actioned:

Balance Bank 30.09.24: \$59,412

Further capital Expenditure \$25,690

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Balance available \$33,722

Of the original liquidity buffer of \$100,000, \$33,722 remains.

Donations have covered most of the capital items acquired over the last couple of months.

3. ADJUNCTS

There have been so many discrepancies between the records held by adjuncts and those recorded in Xero. I have spent hours trying to get reliable figures and believe this has now been achieved. The problem - PKF did not include the 2023 analysis until March 2024 and only entered the 2024 analysis last week. I am checking all significant entries and should have 2024 opening balances that can be relied on by next week.

ADJUNCT POLICY

The Adjunct policy was signed off at the start of the year, but some adjuncts are not adhering to the policy. From a finance perspective, there are two main areas of concern:

GST

Not all adjunct income is flowing through the Club bank account but the expenses relating to raising the income are being paid through the Club. GST is being claimed on expenses but not declared on the associated income. Should there be an IRD GST audit, the discrepancy would be obvious. The 2023 audit noted this discrepancy and the 2024 audit also noted it and indicated that the Adjunct Policy adopted in January 2024 would remedy the problem.

Adjuncts may argue that they have good record keeping but if funds are not recorded for GST purposes, there is noncompliance with tax law.

Gaming Regulations

The raffles operate under Gaming Regulations. There are various classes of raffles with those under \$500 being class 1. As the Club has a full gaming license there is not a problem with the overall 'value' of any raffle, but there are regulations as to how raffles of various classes are to be undertaken and how raffle monies are to be applied e.g. money must be used for its stated (authorized) purpose; it must not be used for alcohol or gaming. The rules relating to the running of raffles are extensive.

If raffle income is not recorded through the Club bank account, but the associated expenses are, there is a clear 'disconnect'. The Club manager is familiar with gaming law and the flow of raffle funds in and out of the Club bank account provides the opportunity for oversight by Graeme to ensure these regulations are being followed.

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Comment

There is a legal case taking place at present where a considerable amount of money from a sub club had been banked separately and not been recorded through the main organization. Funds had accumulated over many years. It appears GST had not been declared on the income. Various legal issues have come to light because of the lack of oversight by the main Club. IRD is investigating.

As the Adjuncts are an integral part of the Club, it is the Club and therefore the Executive Committee who is responsible for ensuring all statutory regulations are adhered to by each Adjunct.

The bottom line is that all Adjunct funds belong to the Club.

The Adjunct policy must be enforced.

The **Next Meeting** is scheduled Tuesday 19 November 2024 at 7pm.

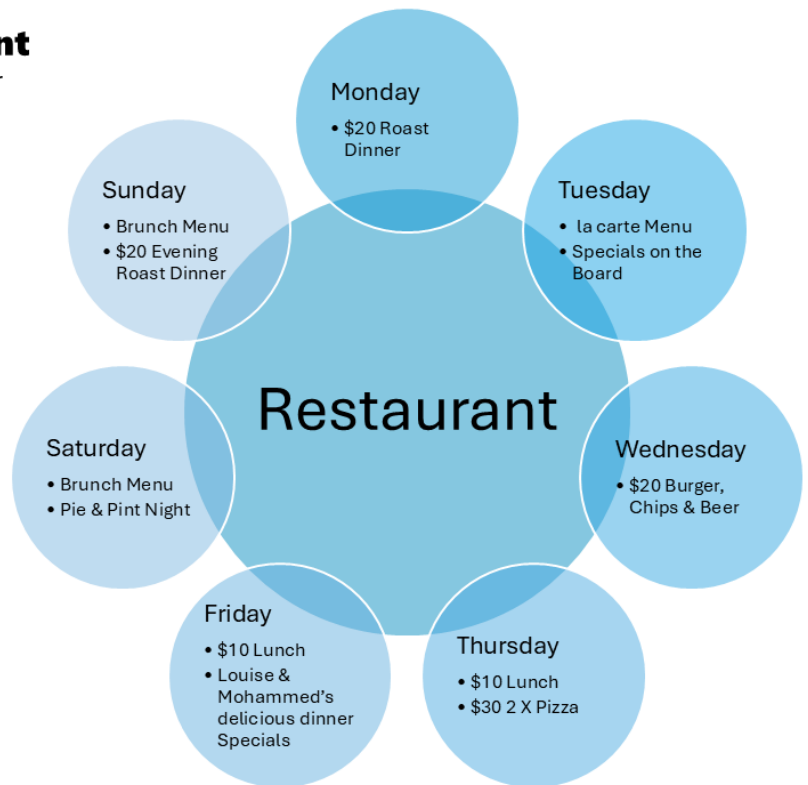
